Attention: Current and Future Leaders of Clubs & Organizations! By Brooke Peters

Would you like to build or enhance your skills to become a better leader? Are you interested in enriching your knowledge about the operations of dance clubs and organizations? Do you need resources to support and promote dancing in your area? Do you need opportunities to exchange ideas with others about issues and challenges facing our activity? If so, the Leadership Certification Program (LCP) may be for you.

To obtain your "Certification," all you have to do is participate in Eight (8) Education Sessions at the National Square Dance Convention. There are two mandatory Sessions (Friday Bid Session and Keynote Address), a range of education classes considered "Core" of which you pick four, and Elective Sessions (Education Classes, Sewing Seminars, Dance Clinics) of which you pick at least two. Then return to your club and apply your new skills and knowledge within your club or organization. You have up to four years to complete the program! The topics that will be offered will be listed in the 73rd NSDC Program Book, in future editions of the 73rd NSDC E-Magazine OR you can go to https://73nsdc.com/education/ to see examples of classes being offered as well as finding detailed information about the LDC program and how it works.



Moving Square Dancing into the 21st Century









DANCING MAKES YOU SMARTER
