

After the club dance, Billy Grimsley and Dan McDonald practiced their new singing calls-WOW, we are certainly blessed to have so much talent under one roof!


On a final note, we had a lovely couple visit us - Louisiana transplants. As the saying goes, " They weren't born in Texas, but they got here as soon as they could!" LOL








